
Letting our Light Shine and Other Themes in the Season of Epiphany

# **AED Information**

#### **AED Information**

The new year brings good news for St. Paul in the form of an AED (automated external defibrillator), which is now mounted and clearly marked in our narthex. An AED is a medical device used to help those experiencing sudden cardiac arrest. The AED can analyze the heart's rhythm and, if necessary, deliver defibrillation to help the heart re-establish rhythm.

An AED can be a lifesaving, though not inexpensive, device. St. Paul received this AED without charge through the generosity and diligence of a number of people. Earlier in 2022, an anonymous donor provided \$75,000 to Door County Emergency Services to launch the Defibs4DoorCounty campaign, a campaign that raised an additional \$80,000 in donations from community members. These funds made possible the purchase of 84 new defibrillators for law enforcement, first responders, government agencies and community locations, such as St. Paul Lutheran.

At the congregation level, we appreciate Clarence Scherer's willingness to spearhead the effort to obtain one of these AEDs, a process that started with his application to the Door County Fire Chiefs Association. This association was charged with reviewing requests, assessing demand, and placing equipment orders for the county.

St. Paul's request was approved. Without hesitation, five members of St. Paul made themselves available and completed the training offered on December 12 by the Sister Bay and Liberty Grove Fire Department. We are grateful to Doreen Holt, Dave DeCock, Jane DeCock, Jeff Kuchenbecker, and Clarence Scherer for their willingness to serve in this capacity. If there are others who would like to take the CPR/AED training class in 2023, please contact Carol Former at 920-854-4021 or 814-571-8092. Thanks in advance.

As with any piece of emergency equipment, our hope and prayer is that this AED and those trained to use it will never be called into action. However, it is reassuring to know we are now better prepared to meet the medical needs of those who worship and serve at St. Paul. There is also a free PulsePoint AED app that will allow responders to quickly find the nearest AED when one is needed, including the one at St. Paul, so the benefit extends beyond our doors.

We are grateful for those who worked together - county agencies, donors and our own members - to make this goal a reality. Please accept our thanks along with prayers for health and wholeness in the new year!


### Men's Bible Study


### **Prayer Shawls**

# Financial Update



- FYTD = Fiscal Year-to-Date. St. Paul Lutheran's fiscal year begins on 01-Oct.
- The 2022-23 fiscal year Ministry Expenses budget is \$258,868.
- General Offerings received in the first two months of the fiscal year were almost identical to the prior year (\$32,301 vs. \$32,309) but \$9,511 less than budgeted
- Ministry Expenses were greater than Regular Offerings by \$11,845 (i.e., \$32,301 - \$44,146 = \$11,845 shortfall)



- General Offerings (which excludes Designated Offerings such as Urgent Need and Memorial contributions) received in October and November as shown above were lower than Ministry Expenses by \$11,845 in total
- Ministry Expenses were higher in October than November principally because a full year's insurance premium and certain Benevolencedisbursements were made in October which were more than higher costs incurred in November for Supply Pastors and Building/Maintenanceexpenses

The meeting was called to order by Karen Peterson at 6:35 pm.

### **Devotions**

Peder led devotions focused on asking for God's guidance as the new Council moves forward.

### Agenda Approval

Karen made a motion to accept the agenda; approved unanimously.

#### Welcome/Introduction of New Council Members

Pam Davis, Steve Stringer, and Renee Schwaller (excused) were welcomed to Council and all members briefly introduced themselves to the group.

#### Minutes

Jeff made a motion to approve the October Council minutes, Karen seconded; approved unanimously.

#### Reports & Action Items

Community of Faith - Pastor expressed his gratitude for all the support he has received during his surgery and recovery and to those who are stepping up to help lead in his absence.

Financial Report – Greg walked through the balance sheet for the benefit of the new Council members and will meet with them to go over the financial process in more detail. He highlighted that January - March tend to be the most challenging times for St. Paul as concerns contributions. Online giving continues to be a valuable tool, with gifts given that way amounting to over 30% of our total offerings. Greg also gave credit to Shawn Mathys for her outstanding skills and diligence as our Financial Secretary. Jeff moved, Pam seconded, all approved the financial report as printed and presented.

#### Old Business

Scholarship Recipients – Four students applied for the St. Paul Scholarships. Karen moved, Pam seconded, the motion to grant \$500 each to Spencer Krauss, Wyatt Beaudot, Marcus Reinhardt, and Trevor Reinhardt. Pam asked for clarification of the guidelines. Karen further mentioned that these monies are disbursed directly to the respective colleges. Motion passed unanimously.

Annual Meeting Minutes - Bob Kufrin has drafted minutes for the October 30, 2022 Annual Meeting. These minutes are to be approved at the October, 2023 Annual Meeting. A highlight of the actions from this past October's meeting will be published in the Epistle.

#### **New Business**

Election of Council Officers and Ministry Chairs - The Council discussed the various officer positions, St. Paul ministries and responsibilities as listed in the Constitution. Ministries are to have Council liaisons whenever possible, though the liaison need not necessarily chair the ministry. After discussion, the President and Vice-President were elected by written ballot: Cathy Mestek, President; Jeff Kuchenbecker, Vice-President. Karen Peterson then moved, Steve Stringer seconded to elect by unanimous ballot the following: Greg Ehlke, Treasurer; Pam Davis, Secretary. Motion unanimously approved. Steve Stringer and Peder Nelson will act as liaisons for the Property, Maintenance, and Cemetery Ministry. Karen Peterson will again chair Local Benevolence. Liaisons for the other ministries will be determined at the December Council meeting.
