Pastor's Page

Dear Advent People!

This morning on the First Sunday of Advent, I had a most unusual experience. I was sitting in a car for worship in the parking lot with Anne and Treiva. It wasn't the same. I was out in the elements for over a year and half with the ushers each Sunday but I was not sitting in a car. Many of you came Sunday after Sunday to sit in your car for worship. Your desire to worship the Lord overcame what we all had known. And you waited for that day of return to sanctuary worship. Some still worship in the parking lot for a variety of reasons and today I was out there with you. I was "rejoicing that this is the day the Lord has made, as we should be rejoicing in it."

Waiting, we all wait. Today I am waiting to get back to what I did before successful back surgery. In this period of waiting, I am so very grateful for Anne and her continuous ministry to me. We wait together. I am so very thankful for those who shared their gifts with me by responding to the call of health and healing as their vocation. They continue to wait with me. For those of this congregation who have expressed their support for me as I have been less physically able than I was when you last saw me, I am very thankful. You have waited for and with me. I give thanks for the friends we made at Mayo Clinic and at St. Mary's Hospital as we waited with each other. I give thanks to God who is Emmanuel, God with us, always with us.

We all have stories of waiting. Some are at the core of our lives. There is a husband who has waited for weeks at the bed of his wife who is hospitalized. There is the couple who waited so very long for the birth of a child, a couple who mourns the death of the child of 14 months. There is the one who waits for the medical test results which may be an ominous message for the future.

Others are elated by the result of medical tests. A couple celebrates 50 year of marriage and the good health they have both experienced. Another couple celebrates the birth of their first child, healthy as can be.

God waits with us in all circumstances; some joyous, some sorrowful, and everything in between.

This is our Lord, whose Advent or "coming" we celebrate this season. We wait for him to come into the world as Christ child, and we wait for his coming again. We who are baptized into his life and death are called to wait with those who are neighbors, near and far away, by being present with and for them. It is truly a gift to have someone wait with you. It is a gift to wait with someone. In a few weeks we will celebrate the gift of the one who came into the world to wait with us, God with us. Until then, pause, look with eyes wide open, and exercise the ministry of waiting. May you be a blessing to others in need of your ministry.

The following are the highlights from the Nov. 16th Council meeting:

- The Council meeting was held in person at the church for the first time since before the pandemic; Pam Davis, Steve Stringer and Renee Schwaller (excused) were welcomed to the Council and all members briefly introduced themselves to the group.
- Pastor Frank (who attended by telephone) expressed his gratitude for all the support he has received during his surgery and recovery to date and those stepping up to help lead during his absence.
- The Council was advised that four students had applied for St. Paul scholarships this year. Karen Peterson moved, and Pam Davis seconded, that \$500 scholarships each be granted to Wyatt Beaudot, Spencer Krause, Marcus Reinhardt and Trevor Reinhardt. The motion passed unanimously and Karen noted that the scholarship proceeds are remitted directly to the respective colleges.
- The Council discussed various officer positions and responsibilities. After discussion, by written ballot, the following officers were elected for the 2022-23 fiscal year:

Year-end Tax Saving Idea - Qualified Charitable Distributions

A Qualified Charitable Distribution ("QCD") allows individuals who are 70.5 years old or older to donate up to \$100,000 in total to one or more charities directly from a taxable Individual Retirement Account ("IRA"). People who hold IRA's are required to take Required Minimum Distribution ("RMD) beginning at age 72. A QCD may count toward a required RMD. A QCD does not increase taxable income which may be a great benefit to IRA holders for tax purposes.

If you are considering a QCD year to St. Paul Lutheran Church for 2022, be sure to timely notify your IRA trustee well before year-end so that the QCD can be received before year-end. It is the practice of our Church Treasurer to send QCD donors an acknowledgement letter which they may wish to have for tax purposes confirming the amount of the QCD and verifying that the distribution was received directly from the trustee of the IRA.

Online Giving

Our Online Giving platform is a great way to make regular or periodic Offerings, especially when you may be away from Door County and unable to worship at St. Paul while you are away. The Online Giving platform from Vanco is a secure platform. If you need any information about Online Giving, please contact the Church Office or the Treasurer.

Year-end Contributions

It's worth noting that December 31st falls on a Saturday this year. If you are making your Offering in person, the last worship services in 2022 are on Christmas Day (Dec. 25th). If you are mailing your final Offering to the Church Office, please note it must be postmarked by Saturday, Dec. 31st to receive credit in 2022.



Financial Update

- The 2022-23 fiscal year Ministry Expenses budget is \$258,868.



Scholarship Recipients

Four St. Paul members will receive the 2022 continuing education scholarships from monies so designated through the St. Paul Lutheran Church Endowment Fund. Each of the following students will receive \$500. Spencer Krause is a sophomore at the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee majoring in Finance, expected to graduate in May 2025. Wyatt Beaudot is attending UW-Eau Claire, a freshman who plans on graduating 2026. He is pursuing an Art Major with a Graphic Design Minor. Marcus Reinhardt is a sophomore at the University of Wisconsin-Madison majoring in Economics. Trevor Reinhardt, a senior at St. Norbert, is currently majoring in Business Administration. We are grateful for the generous donors who have provided these funds over the years. Our prayers and good wishes go with these young people as they further their education.

Council Minute Highlights

HIGHLIGHTS OF OCTOBER 30, 2022 CONGREGATION ANNUAL MEETING

- 2021 Annual Meeting minutes approved.
- Steve Stringer elected to serve on Church Council.
- Todd Rockway elected to serve on Endowment Fund Committee.
- Greg Ehlke, Treasurer provided year-end financial report. Some noteworthy items include:
 - Offerings of \$253,400 highest in 5 years.
 - Benevolence ministry offerings totaled \$40,300, which is 16% of total ministry expenses. Of that, designated offerings toward Ukraine, Local Benevolences, & ELCA Disaster relief were \$26,800.
 - Ministry expenses exceeded offerings by \$4,000. The loss was covered by an approved withdrawal from the Everlasting Endowment Fund.
 - Ended the year with cash reserves sufficient to cover six months of expenses.
 - Met or exceeded most of our financial objectives; though the global benevolence initiative continues to be under development.
- Resolution passed to approve \$8,000 income distribution from Everlasting Endowment Fund to support Local Benevolences.
- Resolution passed to approve \$2,000 distribution from Everlasting Endowment Fund for Post-Secondary School Scholarship Program.
- Resolution passed to approve \$258,868 Council recommended Spending Plan (Budget).
- Debbie and Gary Jones volunteered to accept appointment to the Council Nominating Committee.
