Live it, share it, do it, in Christ!



As always, Council began the meeting with prayer. The focus remains not on the minutiae, but on the mission, the heart that guides all decisions and actions. In that vein, Karen Peterson led a devotion to focus our thoughts.

- Council thanked everyone who worked to bring the AC and furnace demise to a quick resolution, including members who attended the special meeting on July 16. It was fortunate that the "aye" vote was unanimous on the 16th, as Synergy was at the door bright and early on the 17th and had the work complete by the 18th. Everything in life should work so smoothly.

- Pastor addressed the need to help residents find care for senior loved ones. He also reported that Door County Medical is now able to provide mental health services at their new location in Sister Bay. We all agreed such services are sorely needed for young and old alike.

- Council approved Local Benevolence allocations, \$5000 for the Food Pantry Coalition, which provides for 8 area pantries, and \$1000 for Help of Door County. We are grateful for the generous donors who make these gifts possible. The Ramp Up fund at St. Paul sits at \$12,200, with additional funds to be raised from the August golf outing and an artwork auction.

- Council tabled a proposal for obtaining the equipment and training needed to be able to live stream our worship services. Now that St. Paul has dependable Wi-Fi, this will be another step forward in due season.

- Council heard that the search for an Administrative Assistant continues and approved compensating those who are filling in on a temporary basis. We also discussed the possibility of expanding the Administrative Assistant position/hours at some point to include bookkeeping responsibilities.

- Greg Ehlke, treasurer, walked the Council through a preliminary budget draft for the October Annual meeting. The group discussed possible salary increases and any large-scale projects that might be presented for congregation approval. Several congregation members have brought forward the need for improved lighting in the sanctuary and this is one such proposal that may come before the congregation. Council's goal is to have the proposed budget finalized by the September Council meeting. By that point, we also hope to have nominations in line for open positions on the Endowment Committee as well as any slots that might need to be filled for Council.

- Council concluded with prayers for all in need, in our midst and beyond, and with the Lord's Prayer. As always, those gathered expressed gratitude for the gifts that each of you brings to the ministry at St. Paul. Complete approved minutes of the July meeting will be published in the September "Epistle."

#### Women's Spiritual Growth Group FALL SESSION

During August, the Women's Spiritual Growth Group will be taking a break. We will begin our fall session on **Thursday**, **September 28 and continue through Thursday**, **November 2** meeting face-to-face in the lower level of St. Paul Lutheran church from **8:45-10:00 AM**. The study builds on what we have been discussing during the spring regarding the Holy Spirit and is called "You Are Never Alone" by Max Lucado (created in 2020). It is a 6 week study using the miracles in John's Gospel to highlight that Jesus is right here with us and cares about every aspect of our lives. We will "realize we are stronger than we think because God is nearer than we know."

- Week 1: God is with you in the ordinary
- Week 2: God is with you when you are stuck
- Week 3: God is with you in the storm
- Week 4: God is with you in the dark
- Week 5: God is with you in the valley
- Week 6: God is with you when you need grace

In addition to the study guide, there is a book for those of you who would like to go deeper. Since we are meeting faceto-face, we will also view the accompanying DVD at the beginning of each session.

• FYTD = Fiscal Year-to-Date. St. Paul Lutheran's fiscal year begins on 01-Oct.

- The 2022-23 fiscal year Ministry Expenses budget is \$258,868.
- General Offerings received in the first nine months of the fiscal year were \$5,655 lower than in the prior year (\$177,690 vs. \$183,345), principally reflecting lower Offerings received in May and June (down \$8.5K versus those two comparable prior year months)
- General Offerings were less than Ministry Expenses by \$10,841 (i.e., \$177,690 \$188,531 = \$10,841)



- General Offerings in June totaled \$11,061, as shown above, which was the second lowest monthly Offerings total received in the first nine months of this fiscal year
- Ministry Expenses were higher in June than in May by \$6.2K principally due to higher Benevolence outlays to benefit others (up \$4.8K), Program Ministry Expenses (up \$0.8K) and Support Staff Expenses (up \$0.4K)

#### **Online Giving**

Our secure online giving platform, established through Vanco, is a great way to make one-time or periodic donations to support our Ministry program. For example, several members have made one-time donations to support the recent Ramp Up program through our online giving platform. Over twenty-five households also give periodic donations via the online platform. Just go online to the link on the St. Paul website to get started, or contact our Church Treasurer for additional assistance.

#### **Common Stock or Securities Donations**

The equity markets have been strong during the first half of this year. Perhaps you have securities that have appreciated in value and wish to donate them to a charitable organization such as St. Paul Lutheran to permissibly avoid capital gains that would otherwise be incurred if you sold the securities and used the proceeds for the charitable donation. Early this year we opened a brokerage account through Thrivent Financial to enable our members to donate securities directly to St. Paul Lutheran. This brokerage account has already been used for this purpose. If you wish to learn more about making a donation of common stock or other securities to St. Paul to support the Lord's Ministry, please contact our Church Treasurer.

#### **Qualified Charitable Distributions ("QCDs")**

If you have an Individual Retirement Account ("IRA") and are at least 70.5 years of age, you may be able to make charitable contributions to a 501(c) charitable organization by making a QCD. A QCD is a nontaxable distribution made directly by a trustee of an IRA (other than a SEP or SIMPLE IRA) to an organization eligible to receive tax-deductible contributions. QCDs are subject to maximum annual exclusion limits. St. Paul Lutheran cannot provide any tax guidance with respect to QCDs but will confirm such donations made by individuals were received directly from the trustee of your IRA. Several of our members contribute to St. Paul Lutheran in this manner. Please contact our Church Treasurer if you wish to learn more about QCDs.

Meeting Call to Order: The meeting was called to order by Cathy Mestek at 6:30 P.M.

**Devotions:** Greg Ehlke provided an opening devotion focused on having a thankful heart, including Bible verses that referred to thankfulness, followed by the opening prayer.

Agenda Approval: The previously circulated agenda was reviewed, and 2 items were added after which the agenda was accepted.

**Minutes:** The previously circulated minutes from the May 17, 2023 meeting, following a motion made by Karen Peterson and seconded by Pam Davis, were approved.

**Record of Electronic Business Approval:** Cathy reported that since the last meeting, the Council, based upon the recommendation of the Local Benevolence Ministry team, unanimously approved by electronic means, the distribution of \$1500 to the ADRC Bailey's Harbor Meals on Wheel program and \$200 to the First Baptist Ecumenical Vacation Bible School.

**Community of Faith:** Pastor Frank mentioned that he would be visiting a member of our congregation in the hospital the next day. He also spoke of a lunch he had with a visitor to our church who said he would worship at our church because of the wonderful hospitality and ministry. St. Paul's was very welcoming to him, which he did not experience at other churches he visited. Karen had a note from Jeff

thanking everyone for the prayers for his son Mike who is recovering from surgery and doing well. Jeff also wanted Karen to share that the final dinner show and discussion for season one of The Chosen is on June 26th. Everyone that participated enjoyed the food, the episodes and the discussions. The biggest reward has been the fellowship. The group talked about doing it again for season two. Likely to begin on September 11th. Their goal is to get more involvement through local advertising.

**Financial Report:** Greg referred to the financial summary and supporting reports that he had distributed by email prior to the meeting. The financial summary for May 2023 highlighted that Total Offerings for the month approximated \$20.9K which was about \$7.5K lower than the prior year month. Ministry Expenses approximated \$15.9K, which was about \$0.9K lower than the prior year month reflecting, in part, the absence of expenses for an Administrative Assistant. Year-to-date Regular Offerings were about \$166.6K which was about \$4.6K lower than the May 2022 year-to-date total. Ministry Expenses were \$166.4K in the first eight months of the fiscal year, which was \$4.7K lower than the prior year period. The fiscal year-to-date Ordinary Net Loss was \$1.2K or \$0.6K higher than the prior year. Undesignated cash funds available would cover about 6.5 months of Ministry Expenses without any reliance on additional Offerings being received. This includes the liquidity that could be quickly provided from approximately \$51.2K of liquid assets (cash, U.S. Treasury Notes and bills) invested with Thrivent Financial to enhance the church's interest income. The Financial report was approved by the council pursuant to a motion made by Karen and seconded by Pastor Frank. Greg than advised the Council about the expected timeline for preparation of the 2023-24 Spending Plan. The process will begin next month with a review of fiscal year-to-date results and a discussion of important budget plan assumptions in this inflationary environment. The goal this year is to finalize the Spending Plan by the September 2023 Council meeting.

**Pastor's Report:** Pastor Frank provided a report on various matters. These included: the need for dates for the church calendar. On July 29th there is a memorial service for Emmet Shemanek. The other dates mentioned are listed under the Summer Fellowship Events. Pastor mentioned the need of volunteers for hospitality following the 8:00 service. Pastor is to meet with Tony from Quantum, on Monday, July 2.

Worship and Music Report: Jeff sent a note saying "Worship continues, music increasing."

**Property Report:** Steve and Peder reported on numerous property-related developments. These included: A bill from Dave for tree service, which has not yet been received. On the 26th of June the carpets and pews of the sanctuary will be steam cleaned. Steve mentioned the sanctuary lighting proposal from Manning Lighting which needs approval of the congregation before we proceed. Steve has diagrams and photos of various fixtures for us to determine which would best suit our needs.

**Local Benevolence Ministry:** Karen reported on the roll-out of the Ramp Up fund raising project which is being jointly conducted with the Ephraim Moravian Church and the Shepherd of the Bay congregation. The goal at St. Paul Lutheran is to raise at least \$10,000 thereby funding at least one ramp to help those with mobility issues enter their residence. Karen also mentioned that the committee suggested that we allocate \$500.00 to the Bridges project, to help fund the activities for the international young people that have come to Door County to work for the summer. The committee would also like to allocate \$500. to the Altrusa organization, which outfits students with backpacks, school supplies, a voucher for shoes, and other items. The motion to do so was made by Karen and seconded by Pam. The allocation was approved.

#### Old Business:

Cemetery Survey: Steve reported that the cemetery survey would be completed on July 11, 2023.

Administrative Assistant Position: Cathy reported that here has just been one applicant recently; her skills were in nursing and she was not a good fit for the position. We will continue to seek the right person for the job.

**Starlink Status/Next Steps:** Pastor reported that the congregation's Starlink service, was installed by Quantum on May 31st. The internet service is quite good. Pastor was meeting with Tony from Quantum on Monday and he will be giving us an estimate the cost of connecting us to Social Media.

**Summer Fellowship Events.** A discussion was held concerning potential summer fellowship events. It was decided to forgo the idea of a church picnic/barbeque. The Peace Praise Band will be at St. Paul on Tuesday, June 27th and again on Tuesday, August 8th. An ice cream social might be held sometime in July. Date TBD. The Worship on a Boat service will be held on the afternoon of Sunday, August 6th. The annual golf outing will be held on August 13, 2023.

#### **New Business:**

A discussion regarding whether we should compensate Lorna and Bev for all of the work they do to fill in for the lack of an Administrative Position. They would have to be on the payroll with the necessary deductions. It was decided that Cathy would speak to them both and let them decide. If they decline then we would give them both a substantial gift certificate.

Adjournment: There being no other business, the meeting adjourned at 8:00 P.M. with the praying of The Lord's prayer. Next Council Meeting: Wednesday, July 19, 2023: 6:30 P.M. in person at the church. Karen Peterson will provide the opening devotion.
