I am thankful for those who toil so that we may have the lives we live. I am thankful for elected officials who see themselves as servants who speak truth, do justice and work for the common good.


I am thankful for the creation of which we are a part and for all who seek to protect it.

HIGHLIGHTS OF DECEMBER COUNCIL Meeting

Though the meeting was packed with agenda items, many were driven by day-to-day operations. Of significance, was the review of the successes and opportunities regarding Council's 2021 goals and objectives. A lot of needed "brick and mortar" projects were completed, as well as the majority of positive "getting things done" goals established by other ministries. The specific details have been published in earlier Epistle publications so I won't reiterate them at this point.

As the 2021 review took up most of the time at the meeting, we did not attempt to begin a discussion of the preliminary goals that have been prepared for 2022. Instead, consensus was reached that we have a separate planning meeting in January where the focus is on the St. Paul mission as the basis for goal development. As leaders, are we rightly supporting and driving St. Paul to be a welcoming family bringing Christ into people's lives by developing, nurturing and supporting disciples and, are our goals guided by the mission statement?

COVID-19 TASKFORCE: "HOLDING STEADY"

The St. Paul COVID Taskforce (Pastor Frank, Dave DeCock & Betty Eisenhauer) has been quiet for some time. Given that information, we thought it time to let you know we continue to read and listen to the advice from the CDC, ELCA and Wisconsin Council of Churches (WCC), as well as the Door County Health Department. The news from these sources reflects that Door County's escalating positive cases this month almost match the number from last year at this time and are averaging 22 cases per day currently.


A December publication from the CDC titled "Safer Ways to Celebrate the Holidays" reinforces all we already know about getting fully vaccinated, wearing masks, avoiding crowds, distancing. In addition to the medical and safety guidance, the message from the WCC's "With One Body and One Spirit Returning to Church 3.0" is theological, ethical, and value-driven. The 18-page report begins with 1 Corinthians 12:26-27, "If one member suffers, all suffer together with it; if one member is honored, all rejoice together with it. Now you are a body of Christ and individually members in it." The report goes on to speak to telling the truth in public about the nature and severity of COVID-19, supporting public health needs and valuing the lives of others over our own.

While the factual data abounds from many sources supporting our guidance to "hold steady," a deeper responsibility to the congregation and beyond must also be driven by our compassion for and truth to each other. Sometimes that is difficult, but your taskforce believes it could be life-saving.

FINANCIAL UDATE



- FYTD = Fiscal Year-to-Date. St. Paul Lutheran's fiscal year begins on 01-Oct.
- The 2021-22 fiscal year Ministry Expenses budget is \$250,954
- Regular Offerings in the two months of the current fiscal year were lower than budgeted by \$7,771 (\$32,309 - \$40,080) and were (\$7,439) or (19%) less than received in October and November 2020
- Ministry Expenses were higher than in the prior year period by \$349, principally reflecting a full year payment of Insurance premiums that was largely offset by lower Building & Maintenance Expenses and Staff Ministry Expenses

FINANCIAL UPDATE



- FYTD = Fiscal Year-to-Date. St. Paul Lutheran's fiscal year begins on 01-Oct.
- Offerings in the first two months of the 2021-22 fiscal year varied substantially (i.e., \$20,350 in October and 11,959 in November, respectively)
- Ministry Expenses were less variable as \$19,807 of Ministry Expenses were incurred in October and \$17,927 in November
- The variability of monthly Offerings highlights the need for strong ongoing liquidity management

Meeting Call to Order

The meeting was called to order by Betty Eisenhauer at 6:35 P.M.

Devotions

Karen provided an opening devotion and a prayer.

Agenda Approval

The previously circulated agenda was reviewed and accepted by acclamation.

Minutes

The previously circulated minutes from the October20, 2021 meeting, following a motion made by Karen and seconded by Greg, were approved.

Record of Electronic Business Approval

Betty reported that there was no electronic business conducted by the Council since the October meeting.

REPORTS AND MINISTRY ACTION ITEMS

Community of Faith

Karen reported that members were collecting donated fabric and other sewing items to send to Fort McCoyfor the Afghan refugees.

Pastor's Report

Pastor Frank provided a report on various matters. Several members who had been in the hospital had been released and returned home. Nursing home and hospital visits remain challenging due to Covid.

Financial Report

October donations were down \$6,400 from the same period last year; however, the amount is consistent with the amount expected in the budget. Expenses were also consistent with several one-time expenses such as workers' compensation and insurance.

COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

Greg discussed the interest income earned by the Endowment funds and that the Church qualified for \$9,558 as part as the Employee Retention Tax Credit program.

Motion by Karen seconded by Jeff to approve the financial report. All ayes.

MINISTRY ACTION ITEMS

Communications Technology: Bob reported on the action taken at the last Committee meeting where they decided to split up the responsibilities as outlined in the Church Constitution, which is a separate Communications Committee concentrating on all forms of communications with the members and a Technology Committee concentrating on the computers, network, internet access and related hardware and software. Betty assigned herself as the Chair of the Communications Committee. Betty assigned Bob as the Chair of the Technology Committee.

OTHER BUSINESS

Betty recommended the approval of a \$500 scholarship per student applicant as follows for their college expenses in 2022: Ava Beaudot, Anika Peterson, Marcus Reinhardt, Trevor Reinhardt. Motion by Pastor Frank seconded by Bob, all aye.

Pastor Frank mentioned that two people have spoken to him regarding serving on a global benevolence committee. There was no feedback on the Cemetery Policy announced at the Annual Meeting. The Council agreed that changes were needed for church security especially access to the Church office. Peder would be asked to re-key all outside doors and secure the both church offices. Office keys would be provided to the individual in the following positions: Administrative Assistant, Pastor, Council President, Council Treasurer, Finance Secretary, Property & Maintenance Chair, Technology Chair and the custodian.

Each of the Committee chairs were asked to develop a list of possible goals for 2022 to be discussed at the December meeting. The possible goals need to be sent to Betty by December 12th.

The Council also discussed the Giving Tree, how it originated, who has run the program the past several years and if there was a better way to help others in need. The Council felt that a season of service during Christmas through anonymous action would be as effective. The Council expressed appreciation for the work done in the past on the Giving Tree and decided not to support it this year.

Pastor Frank reported that he would not be present after the first of the year for a period of time due to health issues. The date and duration will be determined. The Council expressed concern for him and told him his health comes first.

There being no other business, the meeting adjourned at 8:15 P.M. with the praying of The Lord's Prayer.
