We have begun a new Church year, it's Advent. Who is my neighbor and how should I live in that relationship through the eyes of God? I ask you to think on these words as we watch and wait together, trusting in the one who is faithful, in whom we have hope and faith— the one who offers to us unworthy yet loved ones ... Emmanuel.

- Betty Eisenhauer, who has been lending Council her expertise in the area of human resources, led the Council through the hiring process for an Administrative Assistant. With Betty's assistance, Council fine-tuned the terms of the offer. Betty has completed an in-person interview and has reviewed the applicant's qualifications. She recommended that we extend an offer of employment, to commence December 4th. Council voted unanimously to authorize Betty to extend the offer. We further offered prayers of thanks for Betty's expertise and for the prospect of having a sorely-missed Administrative Assistant after an 8-month vacancy.

- Council unanimously voted to accept and welcome Dennis and Connie Stiegenberger as members. Dennis and Connie will be publicly received at an upcoming worship service.

- Christmas services were set as follows: Sunday, Christmas Eve, 9:00am, 5:30pm and 7:30pm; Monday, Christmas Day, 9:00am. All services will be offered both in-sanctuary and parking lot. The usual 8am and 9:30am worship will resume on Sunday, December 31.

- Council unanimously approved a \$1,500 gift, taken from Local Benevolence funds, to the Boys and Girls Club of Door County to purchase gifts for those in need.

- Council heard that St. Paul is on a cusp of having a new membership directory, thanks to volunteers. Members may either submit their own photo or can have a photo taken on a Sunday morning. The goal is to have an in-house directory ready for use in the coming weeks.



October 2023 Financial Summary

- Total Offerings in October totaled \$13,000, approximately \$2,500 lower than the same prior year month
 - October was the first month of the 2023-24 fiscal year
 - October Offerings included Designated Offerings of \$395 for Urgent Need
 - Regular Offerings (i.e., Total Offerings less the Designated Offerings above) of \$12,600 were \$2,300
 lower than last October and about \$9,700 lower than budgeted on a constant monthly basis and
 included earmarked amounts of \$760 for the Diaper Drive, \$75 for Global Benevolence and \$50 for
 ELCA Disaster Relief
- Total Ministry Expenses (i.e., excluding Dedicated Funds and Endowment-related expenses) were \$21,400, or \$1,400 lower, than in October 2022 and \$3,600 lower than budgeted
 - Full year Insurance premiums were paid in October including \$4,100 for liability coverage and \$1,200 for Workman's Compensation coverage
 - Pastoral Expenses of \$11,800 were approximately \$800 lower than budgeted while Support Staff
 Expenses of \$2,800 were about \$500 lower than budgeted
 - There were no Benevolence outlays in October

- Undesignated cash (i.e., the Checking Other sub-account) in the Nicolet Bank checking account was \$36,700 as of October month-end
 - This would cover approximately 1.7 months of budgeted Ministry Expenses

COUNCIL MINUTES – October 18, 2023

Mission: St. Paul Lutheran Church is a welcoming family bringing Christ into people's lives by developing, nurturing and supporting disciples.

Council Members Present: Cathy Mestek, Pastor Frank, Greg Ehlke, Jeff Kuchenbecker (by phone), Karen

Peterson, Steve Stringer, Pam Davis Absent/Excused: Renee Schwaller, Peder Nelson

Meeting Call to Order: The meeting was called to Order by President, Cathy Mestek, at 6:30 P.M.

Devotion: The devotion was presented by Cathy who shared a humorous look at aging.

Agenda Approval: The previously circulated agenda was approved by all.

September Council Minutes Approval: The previously circulated September Council Minutes were approved, following a motion made by Karen and seconded by Steve. Pam had said she thought having both the highlights of the meeting and then the following month the minutes of the same meeting was redundant. However, Pastor said that the highlights come shortly after the meeting whereas the complete minutes don't come until the next month. He suggested "tightening" up the highlights.

Electronic Business: There was no electronic business conducted this past month.

Community of Faith: Karen mentioned that Betty Eisenhauer is selling her Door County home and moving to Milwaukee to be close to family. She will be sorely missed as she has been such a blessing to St. Paul with all her dedicated service. Cathy mentioned a friend of hers having domestic problems and that she suggested speaking with her Pastor and thanked Pastor Frank for being readily available for our congregation. Pastor Frank spoke of a number of people that we are praying for and mentioned visiting some home bound people.

Financial Report: Greg Ehlke reported that the advance mailing for the Annual Congregation Meeting was completed earlier today which included full 2022-23 fiscal year financial statements along with the proposed 2023-24 Spending Plan and a draft of an updated member directory. He thanked Betty Eisenhauer for all of her work in compiling, formatting, and preparing the booklets and draft member directory for mailing.

He then referred to the financial summary and supporting financial reports distributed via email prior to the meeting. The Financial Summary for September highlighted Total Offerings were \$19.9K (about \$1.0K lower than budgeted) and contained \$2.4K of Designated Offerings including \$1.8K for the Ramp Up Drive. September Ministry Expenses were \$47.7K which included \$28.4K of Benevolence outlays.

Consistent with the advance mailing, Greg reported that \$260.8K of Regular Offerings were received in fiscal year 2022-23. Ministry Expenses totaled \$277.7K and included \$54.5K of Benevolence outflows (about 21% of Offerings). Undesignated cash and available cash and securities in our two brokerage accounts at Thrivent Financial were sufficient to cover about 6 months of Ministry expenses without any additional Offerings being received which is deemed especially important given the variability of monthly Offerings received especially in the winter months.

The Council approved the financial report pursuant to a motion made by Pam and seconded by Karen. A copy of the Financial Summary for September 2023, along with the financial statements and schedules provided to the Council, was ordered to be filed with the records of the meeting.

Pastor's Report: Pastor mentioned more people will be joining and named Pam and Dwight Zeller, from Carlsville, are among those to become members. Karen made a motion to accept them as members, seconded by Pam and the Council approved. Pastor also mentioned visiting a member that doesn't have much family support and how she relies on the church. Pastor reminded her that she could count on him and the church for support.

Property: Steve reported the following items:

-A water sample was taken at the end of September. The report has been received.

-The elevator inspectors came and we now have a new elevator certificate. The bill has been received for that inspection. There is a sign instructing riders how to operate the elevator.

Worship and Music: Cathy mentioned that Jan and Doreen mentioned that the Clavinova is in need of service. The main discussion was once again about the worship times and whether we will stay with the two services. There have been emails requesting both having one service and others that said they couldn't come if there was not an 8:00 A.M. service. Pastor talked with Doreen and she is willing to continue playing for both services. The Council made the decision to stay with the two services pursuant to a motion made by Karen, seconded by Pam. It will be reevaluated during the winter months.

Local Benevolence: Karen reported that we are wrapping up the diaper drive which has been well supported. They will be dispersed following the last Sunday in October. The next meeting will be this next Tuesday, the 24th.

Old Business:

-Administrative Assistant: Presently there is one applicant who does have "quick book" background. She has the necessary skills but Pastor has not yet interviewed her for the position. Jeff mentioned that quick book work could be done online with other people being able to go online to help.

-Review and Planning Session: Pastor mentioned he had not had a review in some time. He feels it would be helpful for the future in finding our next Pastor. Greg asked if the Council should have a special planning meeting, perhaps with a dinner. It has to be determined who will have what position on the Council. Cathy mentioned that Peder would be willing to serve on the Council for another 3 years and would be happy to take over as the secretary. Being an English major he would be an excellent candidate and Pam, a retired nurse with no secretarial skills, has never felt comfortable in the position. No decision was made at this time concerning the planning meeting.

-Lighting Proposal: Steve reported that he has three different proposals:

1. Different bulbs in all the fixtures, which has been done.

2. A proposal by Manning Lighting for a partial solution with 4 lights above the pews and 6 sconces. However he was told that if we wanted to dim them, it would not work. This proposals would be \$14.K.

3. The third proposal would include lighting in the front and that would be \$19.K

Karen thought that the proposals were exceptionally high and thought we could get new lighting fixtures for far less and she has lighting catalogs that we can peruse. The council went into the sanctuary to see how the lighting was now that new bulbs have been inserted. The council all agreed that the present 2 fixtures were not very attractive and do need replacing. Pastor proposed that we look at the catalogs that Karen has and that we not pull the lighting subject at our annual meeting.

Annual Meeting Prep:

Nominations: Peder and Karen are both running for re-election. They are the only two candidates.

Meeting Format: There has been a request that the meeting be held down stairs with refreshments served. It was decided that the meeting would be in the sanctuary with refreshments following.

An Annual Congregation Meeting booklet has been mailed to all St. Paul members with the agenda for the meeting; included in the mailing was a draft of an updated membership list.

New Business: Bev and Tom Pohl would like to circulate sheets asking for people to sign up as volunteers for ways to serve at St. Paul.

Cathy mentioned that there has been a request by Northern Door Alan to use our facility for meetings on Tuesday evenings from 6 to 7:30 P.M. That request has been granted.

Steve has volunteered to take photos for our church directory.

Adjournment: There being no other business, a motion was made by Pam and seconded by Karen to adjourn. All members approved. The meeting was adjourned at 8:20 P.M. following the recitation of the Lord's Prayer.
